

HEC Montréal offers Passport to the World, the most extensive international exchange program in Canada. With over 133 partners universities in some 40 countries, Passport to the World gives students the opportunity to embark on an enriching, memorable experience.

BEFORE TAKE OFF

If you are enrolled at one of our partner universities, you could apply to come to HEC Montréal for one or two terms. For information on the application procedure and conditions, contact the exchange program authority at your university. Once you have been selected by your university, we will receive your nomination and get in touch with you to organize your arrival.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Procedures vary depending on your nationality and the length of your stay. Please note that the procedures can be long and should be started as quickly as possible. You will find further details on our web site.

FULL-TIME BBA WORKLOAD

A full workload in the BBA program is 15 credits (5 courses). For each course, you will have three hours of class and approximately six hours of personal work every week. For a complete list of courses, please visit our web site.

ACCOMMODATION

Finding a furnished apartment in Montréal for a short-term stay can be a challenging task. To support exchange students in their search, HEC Montréal proposed different options: On-Campus Residence Hall and Off-Campus rental providers that offer fully-furnished bedrooms located in different areas. The rooms include all services (electricity, heating and Wi-Fi). Availability is limited.

HEALTH INSURANCE

By law, international students must have medical insurance and they are required to purchase it from HEC Montréal.

ESTIMATED COST OF LIVING

Here is a rough estimate of the amount of money you will need to live in Montréal for a term. Amounts are in Canadian dollars. You will find a more comprehensive list of expenses on our web site.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

HEC Montréal, a predominantly
French school, is again a leader when
it comes to the languages in which
courses are taught and the support
it offers students in language learning.
Discover HEC Montréal's multilingual
approach by exploring its broad selection
of management courses given in French,
English and Spanish. Therefore, exchange
students who wish to do so could take
only courses in English. Acceptance into
the exchange program is not conditional
upon passing a language proficiency test.
The following scores are desirable and
are given as an indication only:

- English: TOEFL > Minimum score of 560 (paper version), 220 (computer version) or 83 (Internet version—iBT) IELTS > Minimum score of 6.5
- French: TFI > Minimum score of 750

Students at HEC Montréal benefit from extensive language support. They can pick from several available options the ones best suited to their language needs:

- Business communication courses in English and Spanish: 3 credits each
- > French as a second language: 3 credits
- Business French Summer School, Language and Culture:
 3 credits course with workshops, seminars, conferences and company visits, socio-cultural and sports activities francaisaffaires-immersion.hec.ca/en/

A description of HEC Montréal would not be complete without a quick tour of the city around it. Montréal is a warm and friendly place, at the crossroads of two continents: decidedly North American in the way it conducts its business, its way of life is definitely of European inspiration. Large enough to boast all the excitement of major city, it still retains the relaxed atmosphere usually enjoyed in much smaller towns. Actually an island in the middle

of the St. Lawrence river, Montréal offers countless opportunities for outdoor activities, including some 400 km of bicycle trails and huge parks where you can walk or run in the summer, enjoy cross-country skiing or skating in the winter, or simply be close to nature. But the best news is that life in Montréal comes with a surprisingly reasonable price tag: it is in fact one of North America's least expensive cities-not to mention one of the safest-yet it offers an exceptional quality of life.

CANADA: A PROGRESSIVE SOCIETY

With a population of only 35 million—mostly concentrated along the border with the United States—Canada offers friendly cities and breathtaking landscapes. A parliamentary democracy and a constitutional monarchy, the country has English and French as its two official languages.

Montréal is part of the province of Québec. The largest of Canada's 10 provinces-approximately three times the size of France or Texas-Québec is predominantly French-speaking in a mostly English speaking continent. This uniqueness is part of its appeal and makes it a one-of-a-kind destination

in North America. With an abundance of forests and lakes, the province is also a wonderful playground for nature lovers. Tolerant and open, Quebecers are ardent defenders of human rights and equality between men and women and vigorously oppose any type of discrimination.
